#### Leadership Seminar: Academic Success and Involvement Fall 2019-2021

• This course is designed to help first-generation students increase their own leadership capacities through feedback, reflection, and practice. This course provides an in-depth seminar emphasizing the understanding of successful habits of leadership and the development of leadership skills. It focuses primarily on the traits, values and skills of leaders and the application of various theories and concepts associated with different aspects of social justice.

## *Rhyme and Reason: Critical Pedagogy of Expressive Art* Fall 2022- 2023, 2020- 2021

• This course is designed to foster and develop a critical analysis skill set using expressive art techniques such as Hip Hop and Poetry. Utilizing culturally responsive pedagogy (CRP), the course analyzes the racial and systemic issues of Racism, Masculinity, Police Brutality & Policing, Mass Incarceration, Privilege, Classism, Colorism, and Microaggressions & Cultural Appropriation. The course primarily focuses on analyzing everyday issues and occurrences from a social justice and critical thinking lens.
